## Term 2

At Hermitage Park Primary we work very hard to develop our children's literacy skills. One way which we do this is to practise nursery rhymes each week. In this booklet you will find the nursery rhymes which our Primary 1's will be learning this term. Throughout the week pupils will learn the nursery rhyme in class, which may involve learning actions and may also lead to some other work being carried out in class.

At home children may start to recite the nursery rhymes so we have provided you with the rhymes which will allow you to support your child.
