#### READING HOME LEARNING TASKS

Imagine you have the opportunity to interview a character from your book. What questions might you ask them?	Choose a character from your book and create a character profile. Draw an illustration of what they look like and describe using adjective to reflect their different traits.	Choose at least 5 interesting words from your book. Record a synonym and an antonym for each word.
Can you find any examples of similes in your book? Record three examples and explain why you think they have been used.	Recreate an exciting part of your book in the style of a newspaper article. Consider the layout you will need to use and what will make a catchy headline.	Create a new front cover for your book using sketchbook on your ipads. Consider the key features you will need such as a title and an eye catching illustration.
Once you have finished your book, write a book review giving your thoughts, opinions and rating. Would you recommend it to others?	Choose a non-fiction text to read on epic and record 5 pieces of interesting information you learn.	Create a wordsearch using the names of the characters in your story and challenge someone at home to find them.

<p>Play tennis with your spelling words. Take turns saying alternate letters of each of your words at home. How fast can you get?</p>	<p>Practise your words using pyramid writing. Start with one letter and add another letter of the word on each line.</p>	<p>Use rainbow writing to practise your spellings word, use a different colour for each letter.</p>
<p>Write our your spelling words and find a synonym for each of your words.</p>	<p>Practise rewriting your spelling words in alphabetical order.</p>	<p>Use the sketchbook app on your iPad to create a word cloud of your spelling words.</p>

### NUMERACY AND MATHEMATICS HOME LEARNING TASKS

<p>Use Topmarks 'Daily 10' to practise your timestable skills. Challenge yourself by reducing the amount of time you have.</p>	<p>Create a poster to show what you know about the different parts of a circle, such as the diameter, radius and circumference.</p>	<p>3D shapes have different types of nets. Can you draw the nets of 3 different 3D shapes?</p>
<p>Think about how you have learned to use a compass to draw accurate circles in class. Create a poster explaining your top tips.</p>	<p>Draw out your name in block print on squared paper. Can you calculate the total area of your name?</p>	<p>Use circles in a design for a fashion item such as a tie, tshirt or bag and illustrate this in your jotter or on your sketchbook app.</p>
<p>Look around your home and create a list of ten household items that have acute angles. Draw and label a picture in your jotter.</p>	<p>Create a geometric design for wallpaper or wrapping paper and label some of the angles such as acute, obtuse or right angles.</p>	<p>Use a ruler to write your name without any curved edges. Measure and label the angles in each letter of your name. You could also use your surname too!</p>
