| <p>Plan a return rail trip from Edinburgh to Glasgow for one day this weekend. How many possible trains can you get before noon? What is the duration of the journey altogether? When is the last train you can get home from Glasgow?</p> | <p>Look around your home for food labels showing different masses e.g. 440g, 375g. Write down five different masses and calculate how much more you would need to add to them to make 1kg. E.g. $440\text{g} + 560\text{g} = 1\text{kg}$</p> | <p>Write a list of needs and a list of wants for an imaginary family of four.</p> |
| <p>Help a family member make a meal. Record your process including cooking times, temperature and how you ensured everything was ready at the same time.</p> | <p>Write down five different division questions that have the answer 4. E.g. $20 \div 5$. As a challenge, write down five division questions that have the answer 4.5. E.g. $9 \div 2$.</p> | <p>Think of a topic you would like to get data on- e.g – What are people's favourite TV shows? Design a survey to collect your information.</p> |
