In LITERACY this term we are learning -

- Spelling Hermitage Park spelling progression focussing on a new sound fortnightly. Revise a variety of spelling skills.

In NUMERACY AND MATHEMATICS this term we are learning -

- Algebra Using rules, extend number sequences and patterns. Learn well known number sequences. Solve a range of algebraic equations.
- Money Budgeting activities. Financial Literacy workshops delivered by MyBnk Scotland.
- Hermie Counts- Sequencing and ordering; number lines; equivalences.
- Symmetry Identify lines of symmetry in 2D shapes. Complete and create symmetrical patterns.
- Angles Discuss, describe and clarify angles.

Our TOPIC is Chinese New Year/Scots' Month/Space

- In the lead up to Scots' week we shall learn Scots' vocabulary linked to poetry and creative writing. We shall discuss what 'being Scottish' means and learn about diversity in Scotland. We shall choose Scots' poems to recite to our peers.
- Chinese New Year We shall research the traditions through art, drama and storytelling. We shall complete activities comparing aspects of life in China to Scotland.

Space – Observe and research features of the solar system. Learn about individuals who have contributed to this scientific area.
